# Recommendations to the Superintendent

## EXAMPLE:

### DUE PROCESS/DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- Increase utilization of early dispute resolution, such as facilitated IEPs and mediation, through enhanced awareness activities aimed at parents and schools.
- Ensure the adequacy of available hearing officers and legal counsel to meet the demand in order to improve the timeliness and effectiveness of hearings.
- Encourage more IEP recommended placements to acknowledged private school programs when public schools are unable to provide an appropriate program for a student with unique needs. . .

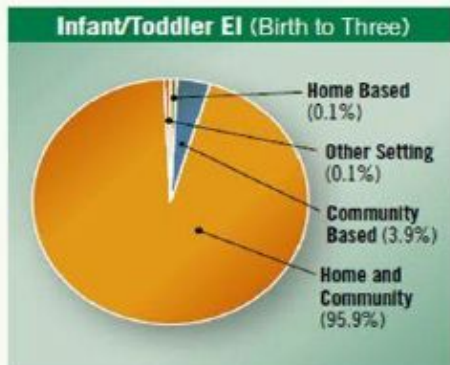
## Family survey data

## Location Where Services are Provided

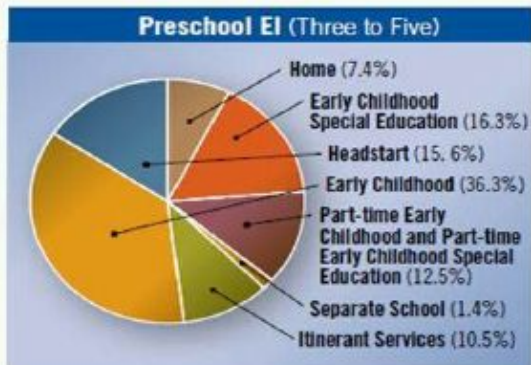
### Infant/Toddler EI (Birth to Three)



**Note:**

Home and community means services are provided both in the home and in community settings, such as child care or recreational sites.

### Preschool EI (Three to Five)



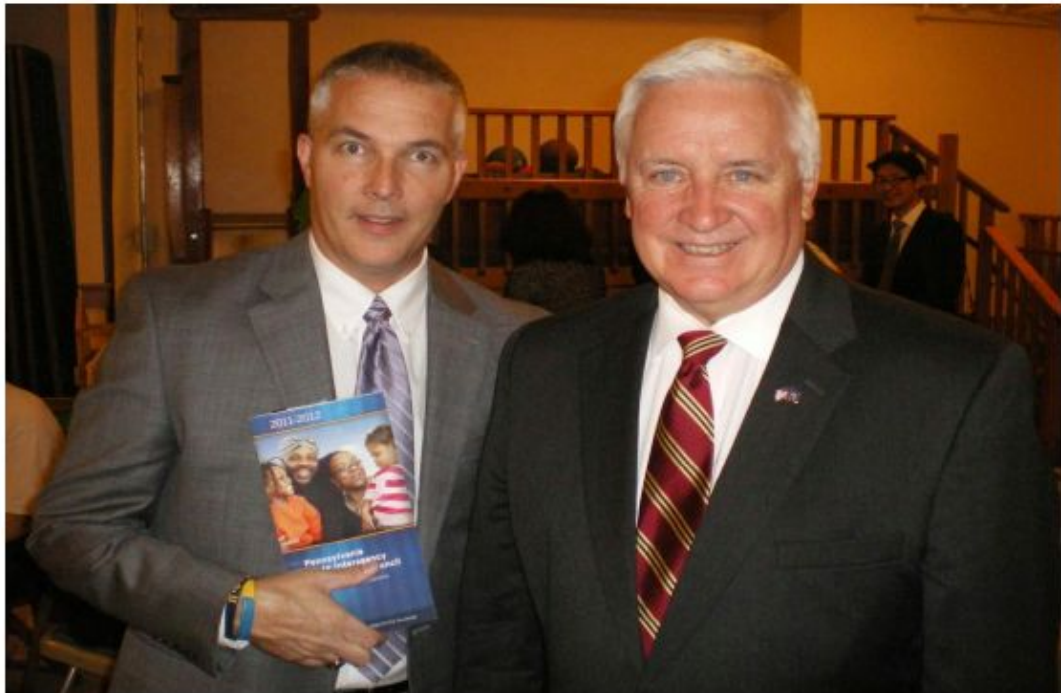
**Note:**

Almost 70 percent of preschool children receive their services in inclusive settings.

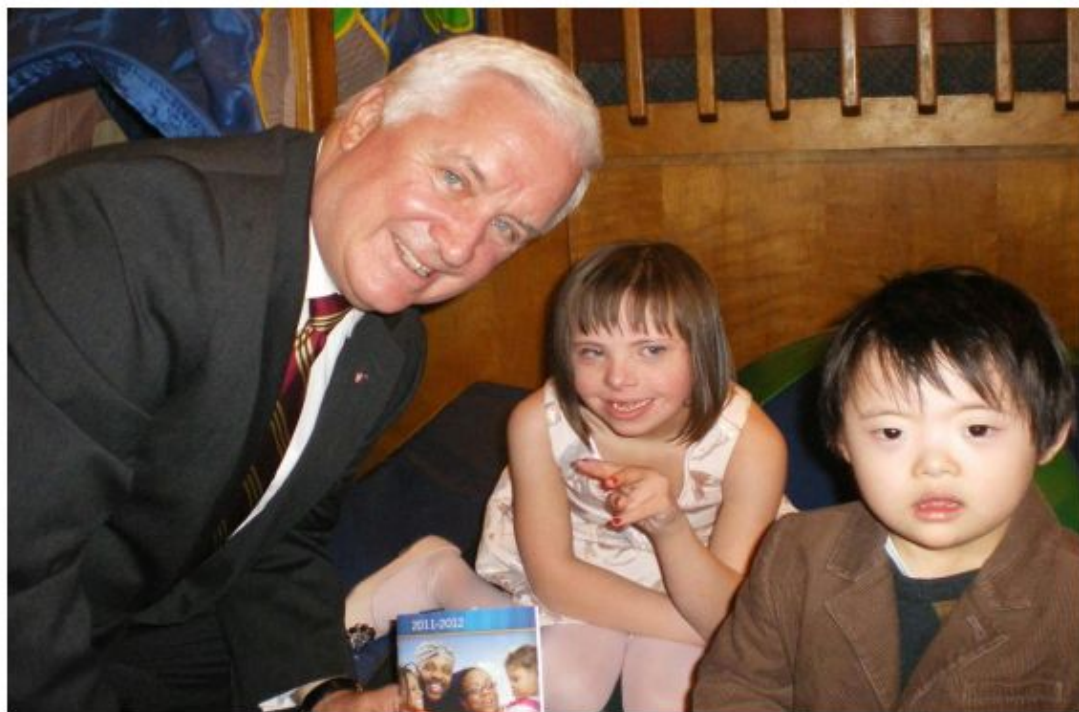
## Funding for Services


**Notes:**

1. State funds for 0-3 include funding for services and service coordination. State funds for 0-3 do not include the 10% match in funds from each county.
2. Federal funds include IDEA and Medical Assistance funds.
3. 2011-2012 numbers indicate allocated funds.  
Final expenditure numbers will not be available until January 2013.

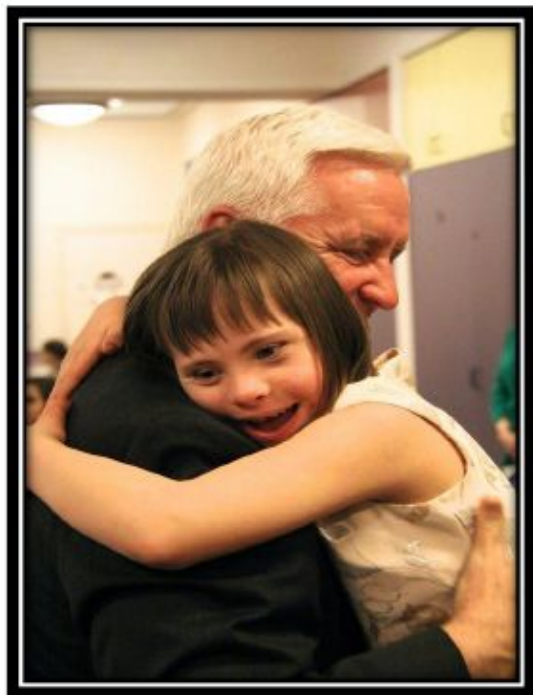
